During the workshop, participants were asked to discuss challanges, strengths, potential adaptation options and complete worksheets to begin to develop a preliminary adaptation implementation plan. Copies of the completed worksheets are included in Annex 3, 4 and 5.

- Workshop Evaluations: Participants were asked to evaluate the value and facilitation of the workshop. These evaluations are included in Annex 6.

#### Workshop Discussions, Next Steps and Lessons Learned

#### Main discussion points

#### MESP

- Encouraged the municipalities for their upcoming work on MDPs, and reminded on the harmonization of the planning documents in accordance with the law and in line with administrative procedures and guidelines provided by MESP.

- Proposed the continual cooperation between local and central authorities within each planning step, in order to minimize disharmony with the regulations and prevent from the consequent rejections by the ministry.

- Called for mobilization of all stakeholders in the process, including multi-sectoral approach, citizens and NGOs involvement. Public participation within the process, was highlighted as one of the preconditions for approval of the plans by the MESP.

- Offered support to the municipalities in technical trainings in urban planning and issuing of the construction permits and direct assistance in developing of MDPs and other planning documents.

#### MLGA

- Emphasized the importance of the coordination with the Government and the ministries for sustainable planning processes.

- Invited the municipalities to address the ministry with the lists of concrete needs for any kind of support (trainings, advices, documentation).

#### **Municipality of Mitrovica South**

- Highlighted the importance of the multi-sectoral approach applied during the workshop and urged that the same approach shoud be extended in the daily work in municipalities.

-Regarding the establishment of the Spatial Database in thier municipality, officers listed challenges mainly related to the lack of experience, low staff familiarity with GIS softwares, processing and migration of the data etc.

- Appreciated the readiness of the Northern officers to assist in the Spatial Database process for Mitrovica South.

- Highly appreciated the UN-Habitat's commitment and support and reiterated the continuing need for support and for further facilitate cooperation with the different levels of governance in Kosovo.

- Expressed their commitment for future cooperation both in inter-municipal and inter-institutional level.

#### **Municipality of Mitrovica North**

- Encouraged municipal officers to maximize their efforts towards better final planning documents

- Municipal officers warned on poor Serbian translation of the laws, administrative instructions and other acts and suggested to the ministry to consider the translation of the original documents in Serbian because the incorrect interpretation of the law and the guidelines is making their work difficult.

- Regarding mobility issues officers emphasized the parking problem as the utmost priority and gave other details on the challenges they will have in their municipality as soon as they start with the mobility plan. Among other things, lack of staff, professional expertise, profiled NGOs, etc.

- The readiness of the Southern officers to assist in the SUMP process for Mitrovica North was considered highly valuable. - Highly appreciated the UN-Habitat's commitment and support and reiterated the continuing need for support and for further facilitate cooperation with the different levels of governance in Kosovo.

- Expressed their commitment for future cooperation both in inter-municipal and inter-institutional level.

#### Key Messages and Lessons Learned

- The Inclusive Development Programme has contributed to strengthening municipal capacities by implementing among others tailored spatial planning as well as data collection and management approaches.

- Lessons learnt drawn from the support provided to the programme partners are a useful source of information in addressing municipal challenges to in-house spatial planning processes.

- Building inter-municipal relations and establishing cooperation on the processes and experiences that respective municipalities have undergone is crucial for the better functioning of municipalities in the future.

- The municipality, with the support of the programme has used creative mechanisms to mitigate the limited municipal technical capacities by mobilizing other local stakeholders. It has enabled them to achieve the objectives and further strengthen local capacities, which is a valuable resource for Mitrovica South and beyond.

- A lot of preparatory work, including strengthening municipal capacities activities has been done. The municipalities' commitment for managing such process is crucial and adds value to the final outputs.

- Through the sustainability screening excercise and identified strengths and weaknesses within the laws, regulations, planning documents and processes, municipal officers discussed modalities which will facilitate planning the required actions to be undertaken.

- The workshop improved understanding of the aim, scope and outcome of each MDP evaluation tool among municipal officers, with the aim of building the necessary capacities for the following MDP/UDP evaluation activities and better understanding of the importance and content of planning documents as a basis for initiating the drafting of new documents, in this case MDP for both Mitrovicas.

## **INTRODUCTION**

### Evaluation of the Municipal Development Plan in relation to the Integrated Municipal Database and drafting of the new Municipal Development Plan.

From the 9<sup>th</sup> to the 12<sup>th</sup> of July 2018, a "Municipal Development Plan (MDP) evaluation workshop" for the partner municipalities of Mitrovica South and Mitrovica North, facilitated by the UN-Habitat Kosovo Office, took place in Hotel "Molika", Bitola, Macedonia. The event is framed within the Inclusive Development Programme with the participation of the Ministry of Environment and Spatial Planning (MESP) and the Ministry of Local Government Administration (MLGA).

The main purpose of the workshop was to:

(1) foster inter-institutional cooperation by enabling professional exchange between Mitrovica South and North at the technical level and supporting the development of a roadmap for respective sectorial planning processes and,

(2) Initiate the MDP evaluation process and improve the understanding of MDP evaluation tools among municipal officials.

The methodology applied in the workshop consisted of presentations followed by plenary discussions, and of working sessions in which group exercises were conducted and presented, according to the prepared evaluation tools and matrixes.

#### **Target audience**

The target audience for the MDP evaluation workshop was comprised of: 1) Municipal officials from the partner municipalities of the North and South Mitrovica and 2) representatives of the Ministry of Environment and Spatial Planning (MESP) and the Ministry of Local Government Administration (MLGA). The workshop was also attended by the representatives of the northbased Institute for Spatial Planning, Ministry of Infrastructure and civil society from Mitrovica South.

#### **Expected outcomes**

An overall expectation for the workshop were correlated with fostering the Inter-Municipal Cooperation between Mitrovica North and South, through exchange of experience and coordination in consolidation of the Work Plan of the Programme and also towards contribution to the municipal planning processes of both, through mutual advise on particular planning documents (SUMP & MDP).

Particularly, the workshop aimed to provide an insight on the main achievements of the Programme in these two municipalities, main activities, challenges and identified solutions in establishing the Spatial Planning Database in Mitrovica North, and in initiating the Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan Mitrovica South. It was also expected that representatives from both municipalities would identify the main challenges, opportunities and potential solutions towards a roadmap for respective planning processes, building on the shared experiences between them. Besides, it was expected for the participants to familiarize with MDP Evaluation tools, improve knowledge of the purpose, scope and outcome of each tool, with the aim to increase their understanding of the subsequent MDP evaluation activities.

One of the expectations was related to identification of the strengths and weaknesses within the laws, regulations and planning documents with the aim to orient the municipalities' upcoming activities. Finally, by gathering the representatives of the local and central level authorities in one place, the workshop was expected to provide prospects for strengthening inter-municipal and municipal-government level dialogue through exchange of ideas and interactive approach to the solutions for the issues and cooperation challenges between these actors.

#### **Participants**

The total number of participants was fifty-four (54), including UN-Habitat representatives. Twenty-five (25) participants from Mitrovica South, eleven (11) from Mitrovica North, nine (9) from central level institutions (MESP, MLGA, MI) and one (1) participant from NGO sector. The sex ratio was 23 (40%) females and 32 (60%) males.

#### <u>DAY 1</u>

#### **Opening remarks**

The first day was dedicated to presentation of the workshop as a platform for professional exchange, and identification of meeting points towards a sustainable management of the city development. After the opening remarks and welcoming speech by Ms. Arijeta Himaduna, representative of the UN-Habitat Kosovo, all the workshop participants had the opportunity to briefly present themselves.

#### <u>DAY 2</u>

#### Workshop Kick-Off

Before the official opening, Ms. Arijeta Himaduna from UN-Habitat reminded the purpose and aim of the workshop and highlighted the importance of information and experience exchange between the two municipalities in the municipal planning processes.

The workshop was opened by Ms. Gwendoline Mennetrier, Chief Technical Adviser of UN-Habitat Kosovo, Mr. Arben Citaku, Secretary General of the Ministry of Environment and Spatial Planning, Mr. Sami Zeka, Director of the Department for Urbanism and Planning in Mitrovica South and Mr. Dejan Krsmanović, Director of the Department for Urbanism Cadaster and Geodesy in Mitrovica North.

After the welcoming notes from the aforementioned, the first workshop presentation was conducted by the representatives of the UN-Habitat Kosovo.

**Presentation:** An insight on the Inclusive Development Programme in Mitrovica North and Mitrovica South

Ms. Zana Sokoli, first provided an overview of the Inclusive Development Programme and main achievements of the Mitrovica South within it, with the special emphasis on the Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan and the need of evaluating the current Municipal Development Plan in this municipality.

She mentioned the importance of development of the tailored tools for the future work on the improvements of the Municipal Development Plan with accent on the data collection for the integrated data base for spatial planning in this municipality. The main achievements and the state of play within the Programme in Mitrovica North were presented by Mr. Modest Gashi, Spatial and Urban Planner at the UN-Habitat Kosovo. At the beginning, he briefly summarized the main steps within the formulation of the Municipal Plan Development and related activities implemented to date. He also emphasized the importance of the gender analysis, environment assessment and announced impact the development of the Detailed Regulation Plan in one of the Mitrovica North settlement, based on the Neighborhood Based Planning Deliberations concept. He reminded on the Geodatabase development, as very important segment in MDP which is in continuous process of updating.

Besides, Mr. Gashi briefly mentioned the trainings on Geoportals and ArcGIS that were already held with the municipal officers and announced additional "on the job" trainings to be delivered in the near future. The activities within Civil Society Catalytic Fund were also mentioned and information provided on the current initiatives granted through this fund in Mitrovica North municipality.



Scheme1: Converging points and opportunities for teaming-up/Exchange

He pointed out establishment of new Municipal Planning Team and Municipal Environmental Management Team for Mitrovica North, as well as good cooperation and sharing of experiences with central, sub-regional level institutions and other municipalities.

The presentation was concluded with the overview on the convergence points for future cooperation and exchange of experience between the municipalities, such as work on Municipal Development Plans, Mobility Plans and Integrated Databases. The opportunities for "city to city" exchange within the Association of Kosovo Municipalities was also mentioned as possible model for such cooperation.

**Presentation:** The process of establishing the spatial planning database in Mitrovica North Presentation brief:

Mr. Dejan Krsmanović, Director of Urbanism Cadaster and Geodesy Department, from Mitrovica North municipality, first provided the short overview of the process of Spatial Database development, its main phases and importance for MDP. He reminded on the preparatory phases such as Municipal Baseline Assessment, Gender Balance Analysis and generation of the spatial and sectorial data. As he said, the main focus is on development of Geodatabase and its further usage and update.



Mr. Dejan Krsmanović, Director of the Urbanism Cadaster and Geodesy Department, Mitrovica North

He briefly described the steps in the base developing and concluded that the base currently comprises of a very basic data and highlighted the importance of its continuous updating.

At the end of the presentation, Mr. Krsmanović briefly explained how the database works in practice by explaining the several slides with different data from the Geodatabase navigation pane. The presentation of Mr. Krsmanović was followed with the discussion where some of the representatives of the ministries (MESP and MLGA) provided their inputs, comments and suggestions. Ms. Lumnije Demi from the MLGA offered the assistance to the municipality for the whole process of MDP developing, while Ms. Suzana Goranci, from the MESP reminded that all the process and all plans need to be in line with the ministry's guidelines and applicable law and as such approved by the ministry. She thus proposed the continual cooperation between local and central authorities within each planning step, in order to minimize disharmony with the regulations and prevent from the consequent rejections by the ministry.

**Presentation:** The process of drafting the Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan in Mitrovica South Ms. Givlferije Kadriu, started the presentation with the brief overview of the main activities within the Inclusive Development Programme in Mitrovica South, and its three main components related to the MDP, Integrated Database and SUMP. She continued with the main goals of the mobility plan, its importance for the cities and indicated the main sectors, important for the process of the plan preparation. She explained the importance of involvement of the all the stakeholders from the municipality and the described the role of the each of them, beginning with the Municipal Department of Public Services and Infrastructure as the main coordinator of the project, and different municipal departments, CSOs, schools, representatives of territorial communities, enterprises, associations, clubs, public utilities, media, etc.

Ms. Kadriu concluded the presentation with the detailed explanation of all the phases in the process of SUMP drafting, emphasizing the "counting" on 27 different city points and data processing as most demandable and challengeable phases. The action plan and tentative timeframe for the future activities were presented as well.

In discussion, following the presentation, the participants highlighted mainly the technical and logistical details of the implementation process such as: counting time/day schedule, sources of information and data, competence and expertise of the actors involved in the process, monitoring of the activities, etc. The participants came to conclusion that coordination between the all actors involved in the process needs to be improved.

The participants from Mitrovica North emphasized the parking problem as the utmost and priority should be given to solve it by a proper mobility plan in their part of the city. The representatives of the Mitrovica South administration provided all the information related to the process of mobility planning and alleviation of the parking problem sought from the colleagues from Mitrovica North and expressed their commitment for future cooperation.

The main recommendation for the preparatory period was necessary coordination with the Department for Budget and Finance, since the preparation of the mobility plan includes certain expenses which needs to be foreseen and budgeted in advance.



**Exercise:** The roadmap to Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan for Mitrovica North and Spatial Planning Database for Mitrovica South

The exercise was organized in three steps, as follows:

# Step 1: Personal views on municipal challenges and strengths

The 1<sup>st</sup> step was foreseen to be an individual work, where each of the participants of two groups had expressed a personal opinion about strengths and weaknesses of the administration of municipality they are coming from, labeling the particular aspects presented in the matrix by the respective colored stickers.

With the mentoring provided by UH-Habitat and MESP representatives, Mitrovica North group addressed the Mobility Plan, while Mitrovica South group addressed the Spatial Planning Database.

# Step 2: List of strengths and weaknesses of municipal capacities for undertaking respective planning processes

This group exercise was focused on identification of the challenges, opportunities and potential solutions towards respective planning processes in the Mitrovica South and Mitrovica North through exchange of experience between them. Work of the participants was facilitated by the representatives of UN-Habitat and MESP.

The two groups were tasked within this step to agree on the list of the core strengths and weaknesses based on their individual estimation from the previous step and thus to express the overall impression of the municipal capacities for managing respective planning processes.

# Step 3: Mixed Group Discussion on addressing weaknesses

In order to define the concrete measures to address the previously defined weaknesses and challenges, the participants were again organized in two groups, but now each composed by the representatives of both municipalities. The main idea was to propose the required actions and solutions building on outputs from the step 2 of the exercise and the experience of the colleagues from the other municipality.



*Exercise: The roadmap to Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan for Mitrovica North* 

The main outputs of the group exercise were a collectively produced lists of measures to address the challenges, considering the meeting points for future exchange and cooperation between municipalities.

According to respective list, Mitrovica North as relatively new municipality, faces challenges related mainly to the lack of employees, inadequate working premises, low knowledge of applicable laws and regulations and lack of strategic documents and official data necessary for planning processes. Absence of the NGOs with expertise in mobility issues is emphasized as well.

Mitrovica South representatives, estimating their capacities for establishing the Spatial Database, listed the challenges mainly related to the lack of experience, low staff familiarity with ArcGIS and processing of related data, lack of the required databases and outdatedness of the existent ones. They also lack the information about technical trainings and specialized NGOs experienced in municipal planning.

Exercise: The roadmap to Spatial Planning Database for Mitrovica South The exercise was concluded by the brief presentations of the listed items by Ms. Valentina Đerković for the Mitrovica North and Ms. Gjylferie Kadriu on behalf of Mitrovica South. The presentations were followed by short discussion, where Ms. Suzana Goranci from MESP offered support to the municipalities in technical trainings in urban planning and issuing of the construction permits and direct assistance in developing of MDPs. She also announced issuance of the brochure about construction permits, developed in cooperation with USAID. Representatives of the Mitrovica North municipality warned on poor Serbian translation of the laws, administrative instructions and other acts and suggested the ministry to assist in this sphere.

# **Presentation:** Drafting MDP, progress and way forward

Ms. Zana Sokoli, Spatial and Urban Planner at UN-Habitat Kosovo

#### Presentation brief:

Ms. Zana Sokoli, made a retrospective of the activities implemented within the Programme to date, focusing on comprehensive preparatory work and strengthening the municipal capacities in the sphere of strategic planning. She also accentuated the activities that contributed to inter-municipal cooperation, mutual assistance to then continue with converging points among both municipalities future common activities. for This hrief presentation was an introduction to the next phase of the workshop referred to MDP Evaluation Tools. In short discussion, representative of MESP reminded on administrative procedures preceding the adopting of the planning documents and importance of public participation within the process, as one of the preconditions for approval of the plans by MESP.

Ms. Klodeta Krasniqi, a brief presentation with the main aim to refresh the memory/introduce the participants with MDP evaluation tools and their practical application. The whole presentation was followed with interactive discussion, mostly dedicated to the main principles of sustainable development of the "New Urban Agenda" and possibilities for their practical application on municipal level.

> Exercise: Sustainability screening

The main aim of this group exercise was to evaluate and identify the strengths and weaknesses within the laws, regulations and planning processes and to define the potential solutions to be applied within respective aspects.

Disscusion: The roadmap to Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan for Mitrovica North and Spatial Planning Database for Mitrovica South Work of the participants was monitored and facilitated by the representatives of UN-Habitat and MESP. The exercise was organized in two steps, as follows:

# Step 1: Identifying strengths, weaknesses and potential solutions for the delegated thematic field

The exercise within 1<sup>st</sup> step required a division of the participants in six groups based on the different thematic fields. Each group, mixed with Albanian and Serbian speaking participants, was tasked firstly to develop a common definition for the delegated thematic field. Secondly, the task was to identify the relevant strengths and weaknesses, separately for each municipality by respective members of the group.

# Step 2: Presentation and discussion on the strengths, weaknesses and potential solutions for the delegated thematic field

The purpose of the 2<sup>nd</sup> step of the exercise was to self-asses the capacities of the municipalities for the each of the delegated thematic fields, fulfilling the provided evaluation matrix. This step required a constructive discussion among the participants and their consensual evaluation of all the itemized aspects.

This session was concluded by presentations of the exercise outputs, held by representatives of both municipalities. 12 brief presentations of definitions and evaluation matrixes were held in total, each municipality for all 6 thematic fields.

UN-Habitat provided the instructions to the groups at the plenary, while during the excercise jointly with MESP provided support and mentoring to working groups.

The matrix used during step 2 of the exercise included two sets of evaluation indicators and sub-indicators, applicable for all thematic fields, as presented below.

# **Exercise:** Initiating the evaluation of MDP/UDP of Mitrovica

The group exercises with the focus on better acquainting with MDP Evaluation tools, understanding of the aim, scope and projected outcome of each tool with the aim of building the necessary capacities for the following MDP/UDP evaluation activities in both municipalities. The participants were divided in 10 groups, 6 representing Mitrovica South and 4 representing Mitrovica North municipality, based on 7 different evaluation tools.

#### <u>DAY 4</u>

The main facilitator, Ms. Klodeta Krasniqi, first provided the instructions to all the groups at the plenary, while Mr. Arijeta Himaduna contributed with technical information and guidelines. The groups were supported by the group facilitators throughout the exercise.

All the groups were tasked to evaluate the specific thematic field excerpted from the MDP, previously drafted for entire Mitrovica city. After the practical part of the exercises, all the groups had the opportunity to briefly present their works.

Description of concrete tasks, expected outcomes delegated to each group and main points from the presentations are available in the table below, while the copies of original material are available in Annex 5.

#### **Final remarks**

At the end of the workshop, Ms. Klodeta Krasniqi made a short recap of the last set of presentations and advised the participants to allocate the responsibilities to most capable persons within the teams, given the significance of the planning documents they are developing. She further reminded on importance of harmonization of the planning documents with the law, consistency of the objectives and activities, as well as gender balance component.

Mr. Sami Zeka, director of Urbanism Department in Mitrovica South, first thanked the UN-Habitat for organizing such event and MLGA and MESP for contribution and highlighted the importance of the opportunity for improving the existing MDP, using the methodology provided by the Inclusive Development Programme. He pointed out that the present dynamics need to be continued and has accentuated the usefulness of the multi-sectoral approach applied in the work.

Mr. Dejan Krsmanović, director of Urbanism Department in Mitrovica North, expressed high satisfaction with the overall organization of the workshop, estimated it as very useful and invited all the participants to maximize their efforts towards good final planning document. He thanked everybody for participation, especially staff from both municipalities.

Ms. Lumnije Demi, Acting Director for intermunicipal cooperation at MLGA, emphasized the importance of the coordination with Government and the ministries for steady and undisturbed planning process and invited the municipalities to address her with the lists of concrete needs for any kind of support (trainings, advices, documentation). She appreciated the efforts of the staff and thanked UN-Habitat for supporting the municipalities in planning process.

Ms. Suzana Goranci from MESP, encouraged the municipalities for future work on MDPs, and reminded on the pertinence of the planning in accordance to laws, especially in case of the MDP which according to regulations lasts for 8 years, without possibilities of revisions within this period. She accentuated mobilization of all stakeholders in process, including citizens and NGOs.

The workshop was officially closed by UN-Habitat Kosovo team, who thanked the participants for their contribution and invited them to use in their future work the experience and knowledge gained during the workshop. UN-Habitat alongside ministries (MESP, MLGA, MI) invited the municipalities to address and knock their door for any kind of assistance in the future.

#### Workshop's evaluation

Participants were asked to evaluate the value and facilitation of the workshop. The survey provided the opportunity to respondents to comment on what they liked the most about the workshop and to suggest the improvements. Most of the respondents highlighted the practical exercises through group work and opportunity for exchange of experiences and socializing with the participants from other municipalities.

Also, the importance of direct communication and coordination with the central level institutions during the workshop was highlighted within written comments. The respondents expressed high level of satisfaction with the UN-Habitat team, their efforts, experience and expertise showed during the workshop.

When it comes to the general comments, several respondents emphasized the importance of such events and suggested more to be organized.

#### General conclusion of the MDP Evaluation Workshop

The MDP Evaluation Workshop that gathered both Mitrovica North and South municipalities and other relevant stakeholders, including MLGA and MESP, provided a unique opportunity for fostering Inter-Municipal Cooperation, through exchange of experience and coordination in evaluation and preparation of the future steps within planning processes in respective municipalities. During four days of the workshop, representatives of both municipalities have identified the main challenges, opportunities and have projected the concrete activities to be held within the municipal planning framework, stemming from the shared knowledge and experience.

This involvement contributed to increased familiarity with MDP evaluation tools, which will be utilized to support either starting or projection of the future steps within municipal urban planning.

The event also provided the opportunity for direct interaction between municipal and representatives of central level authorities, which contributed also to enhanced Inter-Institutional cooperation and provided the opportunities for future mutual support.
